1 tea kettle \$.50; 1 Dish Kettle \$.34; 1/3 Pail full kettle \$ 1.25;

3 old chairs \$.50; old knives, teacups & saucers \$.25; Cots- \$.17

Total \$ 94.76

I have a wife aged 61 years, one son Alvin Vibbert, aged 19 years, lame by a sore that came on his heel, which affected the bones. Is under the care of the Doctor a considerable amount of the time. I am by occupation a farmer at which I am not able to labor to much advantage. I have lost the sight of one eye and am blind with it. It was Occasioned by the small pox I had in the army and very deaf.

/s/ JESSE VIBBERT Sworn to and declared by said JESSE VIBBERT on the 6th day of DEC 1820,

MARCH 24, 1780

JESSE VIBBARD of Col Samll B Webbs Regiment, having compleated(sic) the term of three years for which he inlisted (sic), is hereby Honorably Discharged from the Army of the United States---

Given at Camp Tappan, 24th March 1780.

Below is excerpts of a typewritten letter dated August 8, 1938

Mrs T J Lewis Manchester, Conn. Subject: JESSE VIBBART S.35374

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of JESSE VIBARD or VIBBERT, 1759-1830, of East Hartford, Conn; Alexander Keeney, 1708-1814 (??) and Benjamin Brown, 1740-1809, buried in Manchester Cemetery.

It is suggested that as a possible means of obtaining information in regard to the military service of these soldiers, you apply to the Adjutant General, War Department, this city, who is custodian of military records. You are furnished here the record of JESSE VIBBART, the data for which were obtained from the papers filed in pensionclaim,S.35374, based upon his military service in the Revolutionary War. The date and place of birth and names of parents of JESSE VIBBART are not shown. JESSE VIBBART enlisted, place not stated, in March 1777 or August 27, 1777. Served as a private in Captain Samuel W Williams Company, Capt. Samuel B Webb's Continental Regiment and was discharged March 24, 1780. Discharge signed by Ebenezer Huntingdon, Lieutenant Colonel Commandant. It is stated that during a part of his service, he was a member of General Washington's Life Guard. No details of this service given. He was allowed pension executed March 31, 1818, at which time he was aged sixty years" and resided in East Hartford County, Conn. He signed JESSE VIBBART, and was put on the pension rolls as VIBBARD. In 1820, soldier stated that his family then residing with him consisted of his wife, aged 61 years and a son,Alvin, aged 19 years. There are no further data in regard to his wife and no names of any other children are shown. (**incorrect. should be 116211)

In order to obtain the date and last payment of pension, the name and address of person paid, and possibly the date of death, you should address the comptroller General, Gen'l Accounting office, Records Division, this city (I presume Washington, EV), and cite the following data: JESSE VIBBARD Cert# 1780 Issued 7/28/1818 Rate \$8./month Commenced 3/31/1818 Act of 3/18/1818 Conn. Agency.
